Background

The South West Branch covering Gloucestershire, Wiltshire, Dorset, Somerset, Devon and Cornwall as well as Bristol & Bath covers a large geographical area with relatively poor transport links. It is also the largest regional branch in terms of membership. Following the success of the summer school 2 years ago, it is in a reasonable financial position, but like all branches has very limited people resources. The quality and frequency of County Conservation Officer Group meetings is variable across the region, and there is a difficulty with involving members in the private sector.
