WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

HELM Training is designed to meet the needs of historic environment, planning officers and other specialists in local authorities whose role impacts on the role of the historic environment.

This workshop will provide specialist training for local authority, regional agency and government organisation colleagues whose role involves the process of 'Enabling Development'.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF MY ATTENDING?

Enabling development is a well established term to describe development that is contrary to policy but which, in certain circumstances, is justified because of the benefits it will bring to heritage assets.

English Heritage published 'Enabling development and the conservation of heritage assets' in 2001 alongside practical guidance about enabling development. English Heritage has now reviewed the policy statement and guidance in light of its practical application, planning decisions and a wide ranging consultation exercise.

Participants will have the opportunity to questions the speakers about the revised document, enabling development generally and to discuss the issues arising with staff from English Heritage, local authorities and other organisations.
